



Section 232 Aluminum/Copper/Steel Content Reporting

Presidential Proclamations Adjusting the Imports of Aluminum, Copper and Steel into the United States Under Section 232 of the Trade Expansion Act of 1962 imposed additional ad valorem tariffs on certain imported aluminum, copper and steel derivative products entered for consumption. For such derivatives classified outside HTSUS Chapters 73, 74 and 76, the additional tariffs can be applied only to the value of the aluminum, copper or steel content. U.S. Customs and Border Protection (“CBP”) defines the value of the content as the total price paid or payable for that content, which is the total payment, direct or indirect, made or to be made for that content. Normally, this would be based on the invoice paid by the buyer of the aluminum/copper/steel. The importer has the burden of proving the validity of information.

CBP may require sufficient evidence to support the value claimed for aluminum/copper/steel content.

Low value shipments (Shipments valued less than \$2,500) will be entered via an express consolidated entry and cleared based on the total value of shipment unless otherwise instructed. Importers wishing to declare products that do not contain or contain limited amounts of aluminum, copper, or steel must provide such instructions prior to shipping.

DHL requires a separate entry when less than full value is used for duty calculation and a separate entry fee will be assessed when the shipment is otherwise eligible for express consolidated informal entry.
